> HOUSE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 696

A bill to amend 1980 PA 299, entitled "Occupational code,"

by amending sections 1801 and 1809 (MCL 339.1801 and 339.1809), section 1801 as amended by 2006 PA 300.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

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Sec. 1801. As used in this article:

(a) "Funeral establishment" means a place of business used in
the care and preparation for burial or transportation of a dead
human body or a place where a person an individual represents that
the person he or she is engaged in the profession of undertaking or
the practice of mortuary science.

7 (b) "Holder of a license for the practice of mortuary science"
8 means a person an individual who satisfactorily completes a course





1 in mortuary science, who passes an examination prescribed in 2 required under this article, serves the required resident training, 3 and is issued a license for the practice of mortuary science.

4 (c) "Practice of embalming" means the disinfecting or 5 preserving of a dead human body, entirely or in part, by the use of 6 a chemical substance, fluid, or gas in the body or by the 7 introduction of the chemical substance, fluid, or gas into the body 8 by a vascular or hypodermic injection, or by direct application 9 into an organ or cavity.

10 (d) "Practice of funeral directing" means engaging in or 11 representing oneself as engaging in the supervising of the burial 12 and disposal of a dead human body, ; maintaining managing a funeral 13 establishment for the preparation, disposition, and care of a dead 14 human body, ;- or using, in connection with the user's name or 15 funeral establishment, the word "funeral director", "funeral 16 service professional", "undertaker", or "mortician", or any other 17 title embodying the words "mortuary science" or otherwise implying 18 that one-the individual is engaged as a funeral director.

19 (e) "Practice of mortuary science" means the practice of 20 embalming or the practice of funeral directing, or both.

(f) "Resident trainee" means a person an individual who is 21 22 engaged in learning the practice of embalming or funeral directing 23 or the practice of mortuary science under the instruction and 24 personal supervision of a holder of a license for the practice of 25 mortuary science in this state.

26 Sec. 1809. (1) All of the following apply to the ownership and 27 management of a funeral establishment:

28

(a) A funeral establishment shall be operated managed by a 29 person an individual who is the holder of a license for the



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1 practice of mortuary science. The establishment shall have 2 conspicuously displayed at its entrance the name of the person 3 licensed to conduct the establishment. The name of the person 4 owning the funeral establishment shall be registered with the 5 department. Failure to make full and complete disclosure of the 6 owners shall be grounds for the revocation of the establishment 7 license. The manager shall ensure that the funeral establishment 8 complies with all applicable laws.

9 (b) A funeral establishment shall notify the department in 10 writing of the name of the individual appointed as the manager of 11 the funeral establishment and conspicuously display the name of the 12 manager at the entrance of the funeral establishment.

13 (c) A manager of a funeral establishment shall not reside more14 than 75 miles from that funeral establishment.

15 (d) Except as provided in subsection (2), an individual shall
16 not manage more than 1 funeral establishment.

(e) If a new manager is appointed for a funeral establishment,
the funeral establishment shall notify the department in writing of
the name of the new manager not more than 30 days after the date of
his or her appointment.

(2) The director shall receive and approve or deny requests
for waivers to allow an individual to act as the manager of 2
funeral establishments under this subsection. All of the following
apply to a request for a waiver under this subsection:

(a) The prospective manager shall request the waiver. Therequest must include the following:

27 (i) The prospective manager's name and mortuary science license
 28 number.

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(ii) The name and license number of each funeral establishment



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1 affected.

2 (*iii*) Documentation supporting the existence of the factors
3 listed in subdivision (b).

4 (b) The director shall not grant a waiver under this
5 subsection unless all of the following factors are met:

6 (i) The funeral establishments are located in the same county
7 or contiguous counties.

8 (*ii*) The population density of the county in which each of the 9 funeral establishments is located is less than the population 10 density for this state, based on data from the most recent 11 decennial census.

12 (*iii*) The funeral establishments are located within 90 miles of13 each other.

(c) If the waiver is denied, the director shall send a written
notice of the denial and the reasons for denial to the individual
who requested the waiver. The individual may appeal the denial to
the board in the manner provided for in section 515.

18 (3) (2) A person An individual whose license has been is 19 revoked under this article shall not operate manage, either 20 directly or indirectly, or hold an interest in, a funeral establishment. This subsection shall does not prohibit a person an 21 22 individual whose license has been is revoked from leasing property 23 owned by the person individual for use as a funeral establishment 24 if the person-individual does not participate in the control or 25 profit of the funeral establishment, otherwise other than as a 26 lessor of the premises for a fixed rental that is not dependent 27 upon on earnings.

(4) (3) A branch establishment shall be operated managed by a
 person an individual who is the holder of a license for the



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practice of mortuary science. The manager shall ensure that the
 branch establishment complies with all applicable laws.

3 (5) (4) The department and the board may inspect the premises
4 in which funeral directing is conducted, or where embalming is
5 practiced, or where an applicant proposes intends to practice.

6 (6) (5) A funeral establishment shall contain a preparation
7 room equipped with tile, cement, or composition floor and necessary
8 drainage and ventilation, and contain each necessary instrument or
9 supply for the preparation and embalming of a dead human body for
10 burial, transportation, or other disposition.

(7) (6) A branch establishment shall comply with each
requirement or rule relating to a funeral establishment.

13 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days 14 after the date it is enacted into law.



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
